GENERAL INFORMATION

All General Release forms, the Disciplinary Procedures form, Summer Program Participant Behavioral Expectations forms, the All-State Choir Camp Assessment of Vocal Health Knowledge and Singing Difficulties form, and Camper Contact Information forms, should have been completed online through registration.

Payment for the camps must be received, in full, by **June 14th**.

WHAT TO BRING TO CAMP

- Daily activities: Neat, casual, appropriate hot weather attire with comfortable shoes. T-shirts must reflect good taste. The facilities can get very cold, so you may wish to bring a sweatshirt or sweater.
- Rain gear: Bring umbrellas, rain boots, etc. in case of rain and heavy thunderstorms. Some years it rains quite heavily, while others seem like a drought. Please be prepared.
- Free Time and Evening Activities: Bring activewear, sunscreen, mosquito repellent, music players, etc.
- Concert: knee-length (or longer) dressy outfit, button-down dress shirt and slacks, or similar.
- Dormitory: XL Twin bed sheets (mattresses are XL twins, can substitute larger sheets and tuck them in), blanket, pillow and case, and wake-up alarm device, bath towels, washcloth, water bottle, soap/shampoo/conditioner, deodorant and other toiletries, hangers.
- Cell phone use: Cell phones are allowed in the dormitory and during recreation times; however, cell phones must be turned off and should not be disruptive during **ALL** rehearsals. We are not responsible for missing or stolen cell phones or other electronic communication devices.

DIRECTIONS

Camp Check-in will take place at the McCrary Music Building prior to checking/moving into the dorms. Directions to the dorm will be provided on site.

If you are traveling southbound on I-35 (from Dallas/Fort Worth), you will take the University Parks exit off I-35. At the University Parks intersection (stop sign), you will turn left to go under 35 – stay straight. You will pass the new Baylor Welcome Center (under construction), the Dutton Avenue Parking Garage (with the steeples), and the North Village Residential Village on your right before you will come to one of the entrances into the campus on your right – it contains a pillared Baylor marquee, has flagpoles, and is directly across from the Mayborn Museum Complex. Turn right into the campus (Baylor Ave.). Park in the parking lots to your left. The McCrary Music Building is the red brick building (2nd building on your left.)

If you are traveling northbound on I-35 (from Austin/San Antonio), you will take the new 5th/4th Street/University Parks exit off of I-35. Continue straight through first pair of stop signs, going past the Exxon station and continuing the frontage road past 5th and 4th Streets currently under construction. At the University Parks intersection (stop sign just as you pass the Baylor Welcome Center under construction), you will turn right– then stay straight. You will pass the new Baylor Welcome Center (under construction), the Dutton Avenue Parking Garage (with the steeples), and the North Village Residential Village on your right before you will come to one of the entrances into the campus on your right – it contains a pillared Baylor marquee, has flagpoles, and is directly across from the Mayborn Museum Complex. Turn right into the campus (Baylor Ave.). Park in the parking lots to your left. The McCrary Music Building is the red brick building (2nd building on your left.)

If you are a residential camper and plan to drive your car to Waco, a parking space will be provided for the week. **You can park around McCrary but a car/parking registration form will need to be filed at check-in. You will be required to check in your keys and refrain from driving for the duration of the camp.**

FIRST DAY OF CAMP

CHECK-IN AND FIRST REHEARSALS

This year, registration will occur from 1:00 – 3:00 p.m. in the **LOBBY** of the **McCrary Music Building**. Due to congestion at the dorms, please arrive in the following window of time **if at all possible to prevent long waits outside in the heat**:

- 1:00-1:30 PM – Last Names A-G
- 1:30-2:00 PM – Last Names H-P
- 2:00-2:30 PM – Last Names Q-Z
- 3:00-3:20 PM – ALL COMMUTERS

The McCrary Music Building (noted on the map) is located on the main campus off University Parks Drive. All rehearsals will take place in McCrary. Please see the map attached to the end of this document for identification of buildings.

WHERE TO GO WHEN YOU ARRIVE ON CAMPUS FOR CHECK-IN TUESDAY, July 8th, from 1:00 – 3:00 p.m.

Residential Campers:

- **Having already eaten lunch**, your first stop will be to check in at the McCrary Music Building in the assigned check-in window and receive your camp packet. In your packet, you will receive:
 - your nametag (which will be worn at all times),
 - schedule for all camp activities
 - other camp related materials (binder, pencil, etc.)
 - one set of the All-State audition music at no additional charge.
- Note: If you will be keeping your car on campus for the week, please notify us so that we can ensure that Baylor Parking Services is informed.
- After check-in, head to the dorm (North and South Russell Hall). Directions will be handed out in McCrary. Please drop off your student and their belongings at the dorm and head to the Baylor Bookstore Parking Garage to park your vehicle. Parking Garage is indicated on map at the back of this packet.
- At the dorm, you will receive your room key/meal card. Head to your room and unpack your belongings then proceed back to the McCrary Music Building for the Welcome Meeting and First Rehearsal.
- Note: Once students have dropped their belongings in their dorm rooms, parents may depart campus if they desire. Counselors will be available to escort students back to McCrary to prepare for the first rehearsal.
- 3:30 p.m. – Everyone into Jones Concert Hall (McCrary Music Building) for the **Introductory Camp Meeting** which is for **ALL CAMPERS**. There will be staff and counselors in each dorm to help you locate McCrary. They will be visible wearing their Summer Music Camp nametags. Immediately after the Introductory Camp Meeting, the first rehearsal begins.

Commuter Campers:

Drive to or be dropped off at the McCrary Music Building (exit at University Parks Drive) at 3 p.m. From the North take the University Parks Drive exit and turn left onto University Parks Drive. From the South, take the 4th/5th/University Parks exit and continue past 4th/5th and turn right on University Parks. Come toward the university; take a right at the Baylor campus sign onto Baylor Avenue (Near the Visitors Center across from the Mayborn Museum – the McCrary Music Building is the second building on the left) and park at any unrestricted space surrounding the music building or at the Wiethorn Visitor Center (across from the McCrary Music Building).

Commuters will then be given their registration packet which will include:

- your nametag (which will be worn at all times),
- schedule for all camp activities
- other camp related materials (t-shirt, binder, pencil, etc.)
- one set of the All-State audition music at no additional charge. Small School music will be handed out at the conclusion of the first rehearsal.
- Note: If you will be keeping your car on campus during the day, please notify us so that we can ensure that Baylor Parking Services is informed.
- **At 3:30 p.m.**, all campers will meet in Jones Concert Hall (McCrary Music Building) for the Introductory Camp Meeting.
- Immediately after the Introductory Camp Meeting, the first rehearsal begins.

Pick-up time for non-driving commuters will depend on the daily schedule.

We want each student at the Baylor Summer All-State Camp to be as prepared for the All-State audition as possible. The opportunity for a Sight-reading Elective session is one which will enable the students to gain more confidence, skills and strategies in their sight-reading abilities.

Every effort will be made to provide students with their top choices, but of course, specific assignments will be made based on availability.

LAST DAY OF CAMP

Parents are invited to attend the FINAL CONCERT held on Saturday, July 12th at 11:00 a.m. in Jones Concert Hall located in the McCrary Music Building. Campers have a warmup and rehearsal prior to the concert.

Residential Campers:

Specific instructions will be given to residential campers on Friday night regarding packing, clean-up, schedule, and check-out on Saturday. Parents can meet their students for early checkout (8:15-9:15 AM) or immediately AFTER the concert.

Commuter Campers: Check-in with your assigned counselor(s). You will not need to sign out after the concert.

TYPICAL DAY

A typical day begins around 8:00 a.m. (breakfast opens at 7:00 a.m.), and is filled with sectional and full rehearsals, electives, optional recreation, and ends with a fun or relaxing activity. A complete schedule of rehearsals, sectionals, and activities is included in this handbook.

COMMUTER CAMPERS

- Plan to arrive on campus daily by 8:15 a.m.
- Upon arrival each day, commuters **must sign-in** with the Commuter Counselor at the lockers/couches (this location will be identified at the beginning of camp).
- Commuters **must sign-out** with the Commuter Counselor before leaving campus.
- Parents will be contacted if a commuter camper is absent from any daily activities, drop-off/arrival, or pick-up/check-out times.

Meals and Recreation

The cost of **lunch and dinner** is included in your camp fee. You may participate in all recreational activities sponsored by the camp at no additional cost (**except Movie Night, which costs an additional \$5.00**).

EVENING ACTIVITIES

Tuesday **Welcome reception**—This year’s welcome reception (featuring Dr. Pepper Floats!) will take place on the patio outside of McCrary Music Building.

Wednesday **Night at the Movies** – (*The Wild Robot*) Movie tickets are \$5.00+*tax*.

Thursday **Baylor Choir Camp Talent Show!** Please be thinking about a talent you can share at our annual talent show. Acts do not have to be musical, so get creative. (Sound equipment for accompaniment tracks will be available, as well as accompanists for those who bring sheet music.) Auditions take place at camp.

Friday **Baylor Choir Camp Party and Game Night**— Everyone is guaranteed to enjoy this evening full of games, movies and fun! There will be multiplayer video games, board games, music, and movies in the McCrary Music Building after the evening Full Rehearsal.

SUPERVISION, HOUSING AND MEALS

Our student counselors are Baylor alumni, undergraduate, and graduate students. We maintain a counselor-to-camper ratio of 1:10. Campers are supervised at all times by counselors, staff, and/or our faculty. Campers will check-in with counselors or attendance will be taken at the beginning of each session.

All residential campers will be housed in North and South Russell Hall. The Women’s and Men’s Halls are divided! Campers live with a roommate(s) and share bathrooms. Counselors stay on the same floor with their assigned campers.

At the dorm check-in, each camper will be given a meal card, **which also functions as their room key**. It is important that campers keep track of this item, in addition to their nametag. If the aforementioned item is lost, the \$10 replacement fee is at the expense of the camper/parent.

Campers are advised to keep their rooms locked and never leave items of value unattended. Baylor Summer Music Camps cannot be responsible for campers’ personal money or other assets. Items left behind at the end of camp will be held for two weeks.

The Baylor Dormitory Staff and Camp Counselors will be on hand at **North Russell** to answer any questions/concerns you may have during check-in.

Three meals are served daily (including allergy-free, vegetarian, and vegan options) in the **Penland Hall Dining Facility**. Students are invited to consult Penland Dining staff about ingredients. Penland offers a wide variety of food options at each meal. Lunch and dinner meals are included for commuters. Campers are asked to bus their own tables before leaving the dining hall.

ACCESSIBILITY

If a camper requires special accommodations of any sort, please contact Beverly Shultz (School of Music office) at 254.710.6511. We will work to adequately meet your needs.

MEDICAL CARE

Medical care will be available from the Student Life Center for all students attending the camp. After regular hours, all emergencies will be handled through the emergency room at Scott & White Hillcrest Hospital. **All medical charges on campus and off campus (emergency room, laboratories, x-ray facilities, etc.) will be charged to the parent or guardian.** Campers must be able to administer their own prescription medications. Counseling staff will not be responsible for administering medication.

LEAVING CAMPUS/EARLY DEPARTURE/EMERGENCIES

Upon check-in, campers will not be allowed to leave campus unless prior arrangements have been made with the camp office. Campers driving to Baylor University must turn their keys in to the head counselor upon dormitory check-in. Commuting students are the exception and must report arrival and departure to the counselor assigned to them on the first day. We understand that emergencies may warrant students to depart early. A parent or guardian must notify the camp office in this event. Unfortunately, we are unable to offer refunds due to early departure for any reason.

CONDUCT POLICY

Campers are expected to acquaint themselves with the rules, procedures and standards of conduct established by the Baylor Summer Music Camps.

1. All campers are **required** to participate in their final concert on Saturday.
2. Campers should immediately report any accident or illness to their counselor.
3. Campers are required to wear their nametag at all times.
4. Each day of the camp will start early and involve many hours of varied activities. For this reason, you will be expected to be in your dorm room each evening at the announced time.
5. Each camper is responsible for keeping their dorm room clean, orderly, and free from damage. Charges will be levied in the event of damage.
6. Valuables such as money, watches, and jewelry should be properly safeguarded.
7. Athletic activities are restricted from the dorms. Running, playing, throwing balls, etc. are to be done outside of the buildings.
8. Fireworks or explosives of any kind, firearms or ammunitions, pets, refrigerators, cooking equipment, traffic equipment, illegal drugs, alcoholic beverages, and any other item(s) that could cause bodily harm or damage are prohibited on the entire campus.
9. Each camper is to be properly dressed.
10. Each camper is expected to respect the rights and property of others.
11. There will be counselors on each floor of the dormitory to assist you.

12. The cafeteria in **Penland Hall** will be open for all meals beginning with dinner on Tuesday, July 8th. Breakfast is the final meal on Saturday, July 12th.
13. Campers will receive a single card that provides access to the dining hall and the residence hall. **Replacement meal/room cards cost \$10 and will be the responsibility of the camper.**
14. Other basic rules of conduct will be presented during our Introductory Camp Meeting Tuesday evening. **Failure to observe these rules will result in parental contact, and/or early dismissal from the camp, without a refund of tuition or fees.**
15. Cellular phones and other electronic devices are prohibited in all rehearsals. Campers will be permitted to use these devices during recreation time and during the evening break times.
16. All campers and staff must have their name badge around their neck at all times during the week of camp. This helps not only us, but other Baylor officials (including Baylor Police), to recognize individuals and what their business is on campus.
17. There is a ZERO tolerance policy for any racist comments or actions, comments about a person's sexuality, inappropriate texting or airdropping, comments or threats about harming themselves or others, fighting of any kind, girls on guys' floors or guys on girls' floors. A camper will be IMMEDIATELY sent home for any of these rule violations. During the camp meeting and dormitory meetings on Sunday, campers will receive additional rules and regulations they are expected to follow. Campers are expected to follow all rules, expectations, and requests of the camp staff at all times. All rules and regulations are in place to ensure camper and staff safety while on the Baylor University campus.

COMPUTER ACCESS AND PERSONAL ELECTRONICS

No computer or wireless internet access will be available during camp. It is recommended that campers do not bring laptops or personal computers as Baylor University is not responsible for stolen property. Tampering with or using internet ports in dormitory rooms is a violation of Baylor ITS security policies and will result in a fine of \$500 billed to the camper's parents. Cell phones and other small electronic devices are allowed but are prohibited in all rehearsals and elective classes.

REFUND POLICY

Cancellation Prior to the First Day of Camp:

Students or parents who cancel registration by 3pm on Tuesday, June 24th, are eligible to receive a full refund of camp tuition minus the \$200 non-refundable deposit. Please email the camp office at beverly_shultz@baylor.edu, as soon as possible if you must cancel your registration and would like a refund. You can expect your refund in three to five business days.

Cancellation Following the Beginning of Camp:

Students or parents who fail to notify the camp office by email of their intent to cancel registration after 3pm on the Friday prior to the start of camp, June 30th, are ineligible to receive a refund of camp fees.

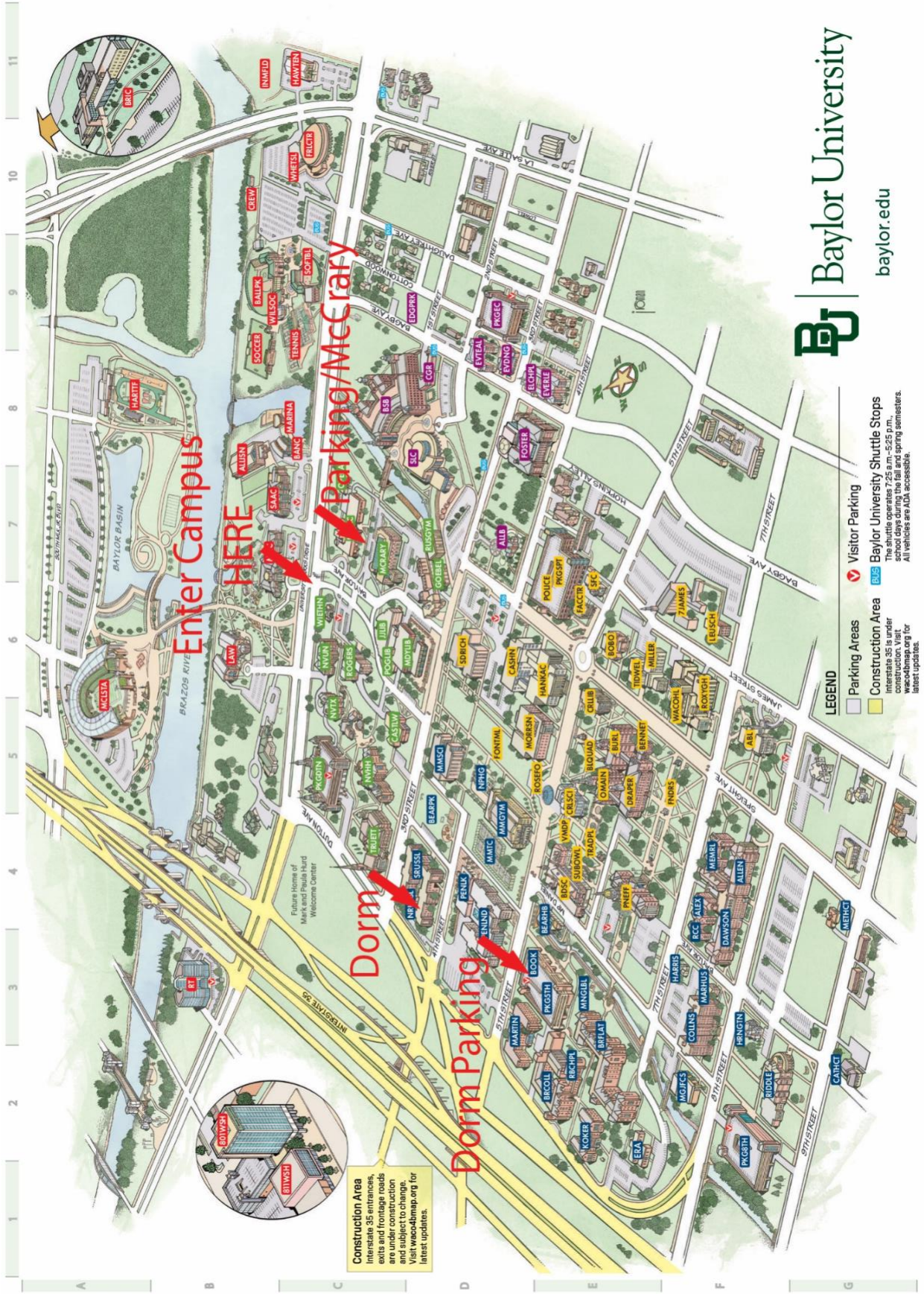
