ARTIST-TEACHER OF VIOLA (Assistant or Associate Professor Rank)

The School of Music at Baylor University seeks an engaging and collaborative artist-teacher in viola. This full-time, tenure-track appointment will begin August 2025. The viola studio has enjoyed many successes that include solo and chamber winners in the Semper Pro Musica Competition who performed at Carnegie Hall in New York, and two recent winners of the Baylor School of Music Concerto Competition who performed as soloists with the award-winning Baylor Symphony Orchestra. Baylor viola students are accepted at many major summer orchestra festivals and prestigious graduate schools; former students have been members of the New World Symphony and Civic Orchestra of Chicago; and alumni regularly perform with esteemed orchestras including the Chicago, Milwaukee, Richmond and Virginia Symphony Orchestras, as well as Houston Grand Opera and Houston Ballet. Our graduates also assume many academic positions at universities and conservatories.

Overview



Celebrating more than 100 years of musical excellence, the Baylor University School Of Music serves approximately 350 students and performs more than 300 concerts each year. The School is recognized for its high academic standards and is an accredited institutional member of the National Association of Schools of Music.



The School of Music offers a comprehensive set of undergraduate and graduate programs, including performance, music education, composition, music theory and church music. Faculty development also is a priority, with robust support for faculty research including grants, sabbatical opportunities and access to state-of-the-art facilities.



The School has excellent performance spaces including Jones Concert Hall, where the highly anticipated nationally televised A Baylor Christmas is performed and recorded.



Students are encouraged to perform in Baylor University School of Music's national and international competitions beginning their freshman year. Winners of the Semper Pro Musica Chamber, Solo and Organ Competition perform in Carnegie Hall and historic cathedrals in New York; Concerto and Aria Competition winners perform as soloists with our award-winning Baylor Symphony Orchestra. Our students have finished in first, second and third places at national and international competitions including the International Trumpet Guild, National Association of Teachers of Singing, National Opera Association's Opera Production Competition and the Leonard Falcone International International Euphonium and Tuba Competition, among many others.
