Camp Faculty and Staff

The state of Texas has a reputation of being one of the best locations to receive a solid music and arts education. Assembled for their talent, strong teaching ability, dedication to the field, and enthusiasm for getting the best out of their students, over 175 distinguished professionals assist with the instruction at the Baylor University Summer Music Camps. These individuals include Baylor professors, high school and middle directors, master class, elective, and lesson teachers, administrators, and Baylor students.

Together, this team combines their knowledge and experience to provide an educational experience like no other for our campers that will help them grow and become more confident in being stronger musicians in their own programs.

Electronics on Campus

Cell phone use is allowed in the dormitory and during recreation time, however, cell phones must be turned off completely during all rehearsals and master classes. Baylor Summer Music Camps are not responsible for missing or stolen cell phones or other electronic devices.

Please note that there are limited times in which students can be on electronic devices. Campers will not have access to the Baylor Wi-Fi Network or be able to plug into the internet access panels in the dormitory rooms.

Portable gaming devices are permitted during recreation time, however, Baylor Summer Music Camps are not responsible for missing, damaged, or lost items.

Evening Activities on Campus

Campers will participate in evening activities each night of the camp. All activities are provided with the camp tuition. Commuter Campers are welcome to attend.

Supervision, Housing, and Meals

All campers will be supervised by approved camp staff and Baylor students while on campus. All counselors and staff have undergone a stringent screening process, completed required training, and received thorough background checks to ensure all campers are safe and secure while on campus.

Housing for students and counseling staff will be in a Baylor University Residence Hall. These dormitories are separated by males and females and neither will have key card access to the other side of the dorm. For instance, males will not have access to the female side of the dorm and vice versa.

Meals will be provided by Baylor University Dining Services throughout the week at camp. All meals will be served at Penland Dining Hall, where campers will have a variety of foods to select from for each meal. Any dietary restrictions or food allergies must be communicated to our camp office prior to arrival for camp so that arrangements can be made.

Parking on Campus

High school students that need to drive themselves to camp will be required to turn their keys in to the head counselor on the first day of camp. Please notify the camp office of students needing to organize parking so that arrangements can be made. Students will be told where to park their vehicle for the duration of camp. Campers will not be able to access their vehicle again until the conclusion of camp.

For the grand concert, guests are permitted to park in the parking lots adjacent to the McCrary Music Building or in the Dutton Avenue Parking Facility on the corner of Dutton Avenue and University Parks. Please do not park in any spots that are reserved for certain individuals or in any spaces designated as a fire lane.

During check-in and check-out, parents are asked to park in the Dutton Avenue Parking Facility, which is near the North Russell Residence Hall. **Please do not block any streets for loading or unloading as it will interfere with the flow of traffic in getting in and out of the campus.**

Directions to McCrary Music Building

To access the McCrary Music Building...

From Dallas (Southbound I-35) – Take I-35 South to the University Parks exit in Waco. At the University Parks intersection, turn left and go under I-35. Remain straight. You will pass the new Mark and Paula Hurd Welcome Center followed by the Dutton Avenue Parking Facility (with the steeples), and the North Village Residential Community – all on your right side. Just past North Village, you will see an entrance into the campus with the Baylor University pillared marquee (directly across from the Mayborn Museum Complex) with flagpoles. Turn right into that entrance. The McCrary Music Building is the second building on your left.

From Austin/San Antonio (Northbound I-35) – Take I-35 North to exit 335A the 5th St/4th St/Univ Parks Dr exit in Waco. You will pass through the 5th and 4th Street Lights to get to University Parks. At the University Parks intersection, turn right. Remain straight. You will pass the new Mark and Paula Hurd Welcome Center followed by the Dutton Avenue Parking Facility (with the steeples), and the North Village Residential Community – all on your right side. Just past North Village, you will see an entrance into the campus with the Baylor University pillared marquee (directly across from the Mayborn Museum Complex) with flagpoles. Turn right into that entrance. The McCrary Music Building is the second building on your left.

Conduct Policy

All campers are expected to conduct themselves in a manner that is mature and responsible, as well as conducive to being a guest on a Christian university campus. We ask that all campers remember they are representing the schools they attend full time, their directors, and their communities. We want all campers to have fun, but we require they follow the rules set forth by the camp in order to ensure safety of all campers and staff at all times.

Important Guidelines:

1. Campers are responsible for maintaining a clean and orderly dorm room. Any damage incurred within the dorm room will be the responsibility of the camper to repair.
2. Any valuables (money, jewelry, etc.) should be properly safeguarded while not in the room or on the camper's person. We encourage campers to bring only what they need and leave valuables at home. The camp is not responsible for lost or stolen items.
3. Athletic activities are strictly prohibited within the residence hall. Any physical activities, including running, throwing, etc. are to be done outside the residence hall only.
4. No fireworks, firearms or munitions, pets, refrigerators, cooking equipment, drugs, alcoholic beverages, tobacco products, vaping products, incense, or candles are allowed on campus grounds for the duration of camp.
5. Campers are expected to be properly dressed. Please be mindful that there are other camps and events happening on the campus that will share common areas, such as the dining hall. Appropriate dress is expected from the time the camper leaves the dorm room until the camper returns for lights out. Campers that are not appropriately dressed will be asked to return to the dorm to wear something else.
6. Campers are expected to respect the rights and property of others. Loud noises or other intrusive behaviors are strictly prohibited and subject to disciplinary action.
7. Cellular phones and other electronic devices are prohibited in all rehearsals and master classes. Campers will be permitted to use these devices during recreation time, during meals, breaks during the day, and during the evening break times.
8. All campers and staff must have their name badge around their neck at all times during the week of camp. This helps not only us, but other Baylor officials (including Baylor Police), to recognize individuals and what their business is on campus.
9. Campers are not allowed to cross any major roadways while at camp. Any major roadway crossing means they are no longer on the Baylor University campus, which puts the students at risk for safety issues. The Baylor Police Department knows when our camps are occurring and will be more present during our stay to maximize safety.
10. There is a **ZERO** tolerance policy for any racist comments or actions, comments about a person's sexuality, inappropriate texting or airdropping, comments or threats about harming themselves or others, fighting of any kind, and girls on guys' floors or guys on girls' floors. A camper will be **IMMEDIATELY** sent home for any of these rule violations. During the camp meeting and dormitory meetings on Sunday, campers will receive additional rules and regulations they are expected to follow. Campers are expected to follow all rules, expectations, and requests of the camp staff at all times. All rules and regulations are in place to ensure camper and staff safety while on the Baylor University campus.

Communication with Camper

We know how important it is for campers to maintain communication with their family and vice versa throughout the week of camp. We do, however, have limited times in which campers will be able to use their electronic devices.

Campers will be asked to not have their phones or electronic devices out during any instructional times, rehearsals, or master classes unless in times of an emergency. Campers are permitted to use their devices during their afternoon recreation time or during their evening activity time (if not a performance).

In the event of an emergency, please contact our office directly at (254) 710-6511, or our On-site Camp Office: (254)710-1044. After 5 PM, please call your students head counselor. Head Counselor numbers will be posted in the dormitory at check-in. They will be able to locate your student and get them in touch with you as quickly as possible.

Leaving Campus/Emergency Departures

Leaving Campus

We discourage campers from leaving campus for any reason during the camp week unless prior notification has been provided by the parent or guardian to the camp office. Parents or legal guardians will be required to provide written permission for a camper to be permitted to leave during the camp week. A picture ID will be required by the parent or legal guardian who will be taking the camper away from the structured camp environment.

In the event of an emergency, please contact our School of Music office directly to speak with a Camp Administrator at (254) 710-6511 , or our On-site Camp Office: (254) 710-1044. We will then ensure the proper staff is informed of the situation and can coordinate a pickup point for the student and parent/guardian.

Healthcare During Camp

We are committed to ensuring that all of our campers are safe and healthy throughout their stay on campus. We understand, however, that accidents do happen and students do sometimes fall ill.

Baylor University maintains a full-time Baylor Scott & White Clinic on campus at the Student Life Center that is adjacent to the McCrary Music Building. In the event a camper is not feeling well, we will contact parents and ensure that the student receives the proper medical attention they need.

In the event that medical attention is required after hours (after 5:00pm) or for more serious medical needs, campers will be transported by ambulance to Baylor Scott & White Hillcrest Medical Center. We will maintain a camp staff member with the camper at all times to ensure the camper is taken care of and that the parent and/or guardian is receiving updates as needed.

Parents and/or legal guardians will be contacted in the event of any medical needs.

Any medical visits to the clinic or hospital will be at the expense of the parent or guardian and/or the student's medical insurance provider. The Baylor University Summer Music Camps are not responsible for any medical expenses incurred during the student's stay on the campus.

Medications

Campers must be able to administer their own prescription medications. Counseling staff will not be responsible for administering medication.

High School Band & Orchestra Information

Eligibility

The High School Band/Orchestra/Conducting Camps are open to all woodwind, brass, string, and percussion students who enter grades 9-12 during the fall semester of 2026. Students are required to have played their instrument for at least two years.

Each student will be asked to audition for placement in the ensemble for the camp. Audition materials are available on our website – <https://music.baylor.edu/camps>. Campers may be asked to sightread and/or perform their major scales.

Commuter Information

The commuter meeting on the first day of camp is extremely important, as we will review the check-in and check-out procedures with the campers and parents. We encourage both parents and campers to attend that meeting to receive all of the information for the week. This meeting will take place immediately after the Dr. Pepper hour on Sunday evening (approximately 9:15pm).

Commuter students will be assigned a Commuter Counselor for the week that they will check-in and check-out with each day. Commuter students will be assigned a check-in location for each morning's arrival and a pick-up time and location for each check-out.

Commuter students are welcome to attend evening activities, but will need to communicate that with the Commuter Counselor each day. A designated location and time will be given for after the evening activities if they wish to stay.

Middle School Band & Orchestra Camp Information

June 14-20, 2026

Eligibility

The Middle School Band and Orchestra Camp is open to all woodwind, brass, percussion, and string students who enter grades 7-9 during the fall semester of 2026.

Students are required to have played their instrument for at least one school year.

Auditions

Each student will be asked to audition for placement in the ensembles for the camp.

- All students will need to perform a prepared solo, band or orchestra piece, or etude that shows off their musical ability for the audition.
- Students are also asked to prepare scales of up to 2-sharps and 2-flats for the audition.
- Students may be asked to sightread as part of their audition as well.

Percussion Auditions

Students are asked to play a prepared solo on both the snare drum and on a keyboard instrument (marimba). This allows the judges to see a student's ability level on both instrument types when making appropriate ensemble placement decisions. We understand a student may be stronger at one instrument than another... that is okay! They will continue to grow on all percussion instruments throughout the week.

Jazz Ensemble

In addition to the band and orchestra ensembles, students will have the opportunity to perform in the Jazz Ensemble that will rehearse during the afternoon recreation time.

There is NO audition for this ensemble and all students are eligible to participate. Students will sign up for this ensemble during the Camp General Meeting on Sunday afternoon.

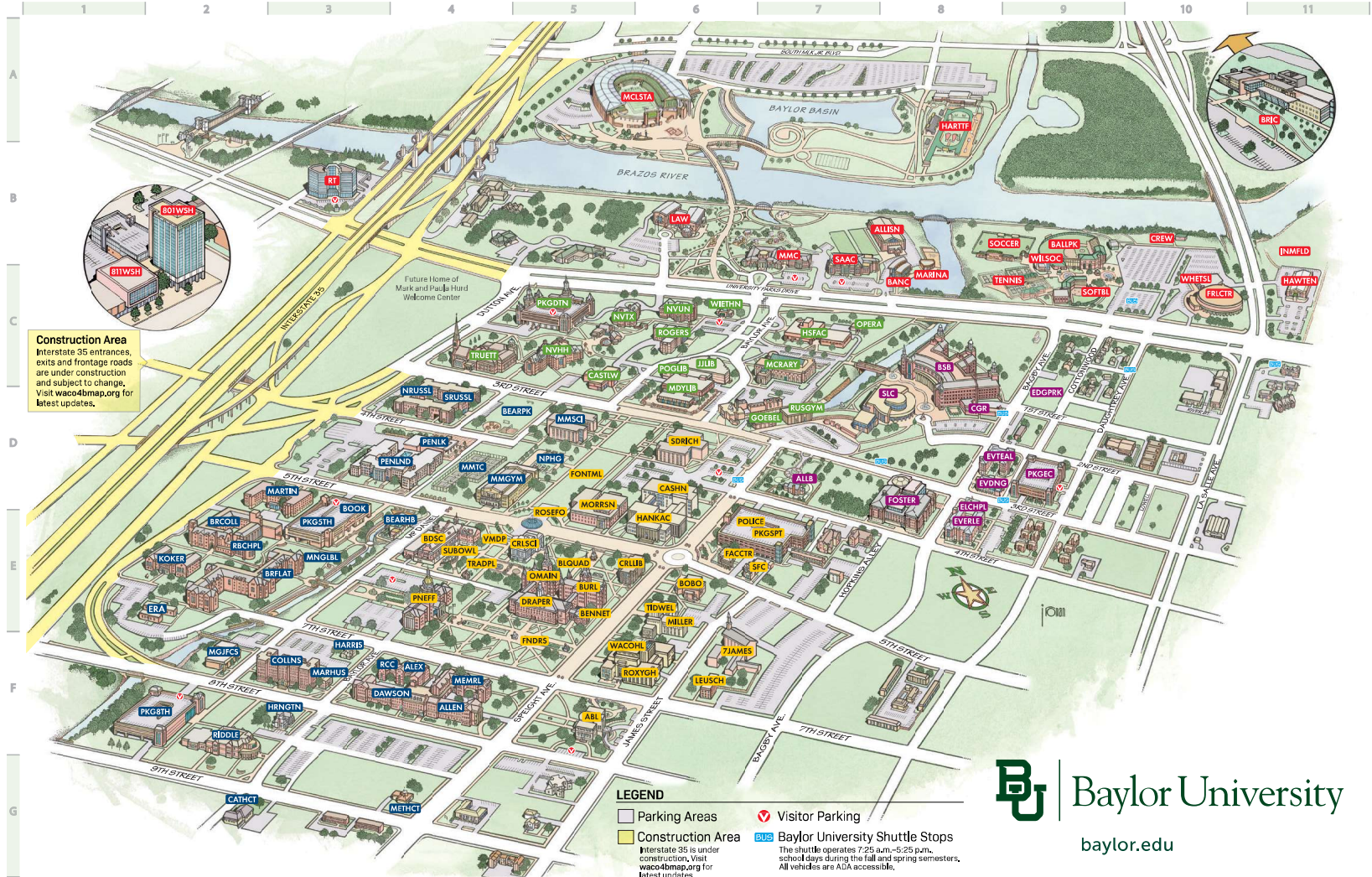
